

Understanding Counterparty Risk when investing in Collateralised ETPs

It is important to understand counterparty risk before investing in Collateralised ETPs. This document outlines the nature of this risk and how it is mitigated by the provision of collateral.

First, let's look at some of the different entities involved in the Collateralised ETPs and their respective roles:

Issuer of Collateralised ETPs	GraniteShares Financial Plc
Swap Counterparty	Natixis
Swap Collateral Custodian	The Bank of New York Mellon SA/NV
ETP Security Trustee	BNY Mellon Corporate Trustee Services Ltd

The **Issuer** of Collateralised ETPs, GraniteShares Financial Plc, is a public limited company incorporated as a special purpose vehicle (SPV). The Issuer is a standalone entity, ring-fenced from other GraniteShares entities, whose sole purpose is to issue Collateralised ETPs as outlined in the base prospectus, together with any supplements and related documentation. The base prospectus has been approved by the Central Bank of Ireland for the purposes of the Prospectus Directive.

GraniteShares Collateralised ETPs provide exposure to the underlying indices through a swap agreement with Natixis, the **Swap Counterparty**. Natixis is rated A1 (stable) by Moody's as of 25 January 2019. (To view all Natixis's ratings, see https://www.natixis.com/natixis/jcms/ala 5477/en/ratings)

The swap agreement results in counterparty credit risk. To mitigate the risk of counterparty exposure, Natixis is required to ensure that at the end of each business day, collateral assets having a total value at least equal to the value of all outstanding GraniteShares ETPs are posted with the **Swap Collateral Custodian**, the Bank of New York Mellon SA/NV.

What does this mean? For example, if the value of all outstanding GraniteShares ETPs was €150 million, Natixis would be required to ensure that it has posted at least €150 million worth of eligible collateral to the Swap Collateral Custodian.

This collateral is held in one or more segregated accounts. Natixis has granted security over these segregated account(s) in favour of the Issuer in respect of Natixis' obligations under the swap agreement. In effect, the assets held can only be used to meet the Issuer's obligations to investors in the Collateralised ETPs.

The Bank of New York Mellon's role as Swap Collateral Custodian is two-fold:

- 1. Act as custodian by holding and valuing the securities posted by the Swap Counterparty
- 2. Compare daily the value of securities deposited in the segregated account(s) versus exposure to the Swap Counterparty. In the event of a deficit, it will ask the Swap Counterparty to post additional eligible collateral.

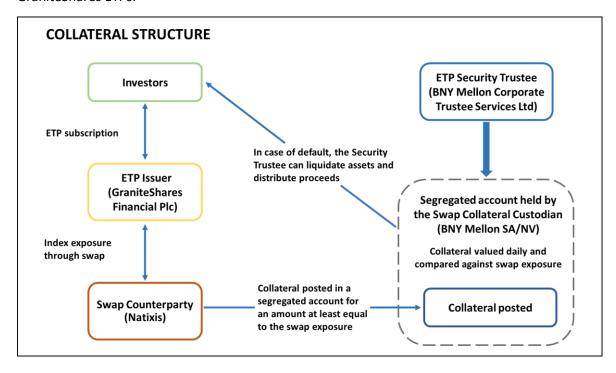
Eligible Collateral

The posted collateral must meet certain set criteria with respect to asset quality, concentration, margin and liquidity as set out in the schedule of Eligible Collateral (see below).



Role of the ETP Security Trustee

In the event of a Swap Counterparty default and non-payment of any corresponding redemption amount under the GraniteShares ETPs, the **ETP Security Trustee**, BNY Mellon Corporate Trustee Services Ltd, would be in a position to enforce the security and to sell the collateral in order to redeem the outstanding GraniteShares ETPs.

Other debt (Eligible Securities) Any (i) convertible or corporate bonds that are linked to shares that are a member of one of the Eligible Equity Indices (as defined below) and (ii) covered bonds whose issuer is incorporated in an Eligible Country (as defined below), in each case rated not lower than "A" by S&P or "A2" by Moody's	100% in total, provided that the amount of Eligible Securities and Eligible Equities issued by any one entity and forming part of the Posted Collateral cannot have an aggregated value in excess of (A) 5% of the Posted Collateral or (B) USD 30,000,000. Margin: 103%
Equities (Eligible Equities) Shares (common, REITs or preferred) that (i) are a member of one of the Eligible Equity Indices (as defined below) and (ii) have a market capital of at least USD 1,000,000,000	100% in total, provided that the amount of Eligible Securities and Eligible Equities issued by any one entity and forming part of the Posted Collateral cannot have an aggregated value in excess of (A) 5% of the Posted Collateral or (B) USD 30,000,000. Margin: 105%

Failure of the counterparty to make payments may result in an investment in an ETP suffering a loss.
